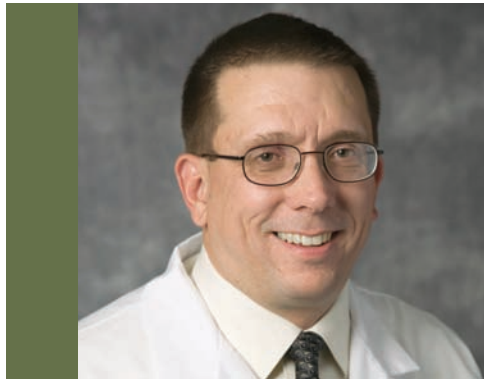

LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

I am honored to return to the School of Dental Medicine after an absence of more than 20 years. There is exciting potential in the OMFS department, potential that builds on the excellence this department and school are known for. One essential component in developing that potential is the construction of a new OMFS clinic.

“Shape of the Future of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Education” is a bold initiative to completely rebuild the OMFS clinic to improve the educational experience for students and residents. The clinic houses 10 residents per year, along with faculty practices and student experiential cases. We bring more than 11,000 patients per year into the clinic. Therefore, we are currently experiencing severe gridlock.

Creating a facility that will serve our needs and those of patients into the 21st century is not merely a matter of building more chairs. The challenge includes the fact that the clinics must remain operational during the renovation. The entire project is projected to cost \$500,000. There are also subcomponents of the clinic offering a number of naming opportunities at various levels of support.

Five rooms will be added, including a second fully functional operating room that will allow multiple, simultaneous procedures. There will be two new consultation rooms; modification of existing patient recovery areas; two new undergraduate examination rooms; a second additional resident study area with cubicles; and modernization of the six current operatories. Other spaces will change as well, including the sterilization center, which will be smaller when it is retrofitted with new streamlined equipment.

The OMFS department residency program is acknowledged to be one of the strongest in the United States and internationally. Our continued success is a direct result of your support. After 20 years of service in the U.S. Army, Case Western Reserve University School of Dental Medicine alumnus **Dale A. Baur, D.D.S. '80, M.D.**, comes “full circle” to return to his alma mater as the Chair of the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS). He assumed his new duties April 2.

Baur has long anticipated this homecoming. “It was always my desire to return to CWRU if I could secure the right teaching position,” he says. “I enjoy working with residents and taking on challenging surgical cases. I'm particularly interested in the management of oral cancer. There is an opportunity here to have OMFS establish a presence in Northeast Ohio as a center of excellence.”

The chairmanship appealed to Baur because “prior to coming back to Case, I was a service chief and residency program director, where I was able to train and mentor several of my surgical residents over a 6-year period. I watched them go on to become successful clinicians,” he says. “As a chairman here, working with our program director **Faisal A. Quereshy, M.D., D.D.S., F.A.C.S. '97**, I can set the tone and tempo of the department, expand our scope of practice, and expand our involvement in clinical and basic science research while teaching residents and students.”

Baur has a number of goals for the department. “I want to continue to attract high-caliber residents into the program and facilitate graduate training for dentists that leads to certification in OMFS, as well as completion of medical school leading to an M.D.,” he says. Baur also plans to raise the department's visibility by encouraging faculty and residents to publish in peer-reviewed journals and by making it easier for them to attend and present at national OMFS meetings. “To do this, it is imperative that we increase the amount and quality of basic science and clinical research emanating from our department,” he says.

With Baur's experience, he is a sure bet to accomplish many of these goals, which is why he is being welcomed “home” with open arms. “Dr. Baur is a superb surgeon and a dedicated educator who has made significant contributions to dental and medical literature,” says **Jerold S. Goldberg, D.D.S. '70**, Dean of the School of Dental Medicine. “His broad range of experience and proven administrative ability will take the program to even greater levels.”

Baur and his family are originally from the Cleveland area. He returns to Northeast Ohio with his wife, Nancy, and sons, Alex and Andrew, and joins daughter, Kathleen and son, Joshua, who currently live in the area.
