

Jeff Becker is glad to be back.

Dr. Becker, D.D.S., M.S.D. '96, has a special place in his heart for the CWRU School of Dental Medicine's Periodontics Department. The newly appointed assistant professor in the Graduate Periodontics Department knows how important the dental school and the Periodontics Department have been in his life, and he wants to make sure each student he encounters has the same opportunity to be inspired.

"My goals are to provide great service to patients, and to prepare the students for their careers," Dr. Becker said. "It's truly exciting to think I have an opportunity to help mold the future periodontists that will come out of this program."

Dr. Becker graduated from The Ohio State University College of Dentistry in 1986. He practiced general dentistry for seven years at The Dental Specialty Group, with offices in Norwalk and Avon. Although he still maintains that practice, it became clear to him over the years that his real love was periodontics.

He attended the CWRU dental school and earned his M.S.D. in 1996. It was while he was at the school that he met the man who changed his life: Nabil Bissada, D.D.S., M.S.D., professor and chair of the Department of Periodontics.

"I'll always have a student-teacher relationship with Dr. Bissada," says Dr. Becker. "I truly believe I would not be where I am today without him. He was and still is my mentor, and has encouraged and inspired me in so many ways. He's one of the main reasons I returned to the school." The other main reason Dr. Becker returned is the students. "The students at the CWRU dental school are skilled and motivated, open-minded and receptive," he says. "And as a center for research the school can't be beat. It's really wonderful to have the combination of such strong didactic and clinical programs."

Dr. Becker is teaching the students all of the areas of periodontics that he finds fascinating, including dental implants, bone grafting, sinus augmentations, preparing areas for implantation, gingival grafting, osseous surgery, occlusion, and intravenous sedation.

He is enthusiastic about the future of periodontics and wants his students to be aware of how bright the outlook is for the specialty.

"I think as periodontists we're extremely well-positioned," Dr. Becker says. "We got into implants at the right time, when they were starting to gain some attention. Now they're growing in popularity each year, and the students here couldn't be in a better place learn all the latest techniques and technologies. In fact, we're developing many of those techniques and technologies right here."

After the excitement of helping mold the periodontists of the future, Dr. Becker likes to relax at home in the good company of his three dogs: Newfoundlanders weighing in at 200, 180 and 30 lbs. The 30 lb. "puppy" is only 10 weeks old.

"I'm just very fortunate to be here, in this place at this time," Dr. Becker says. "It's an honor to have the opportunity to inspire the students here the way Dr. Bissada inspired me."

Dr. Becker is a member of the American Academy of Implant Dentistry, Academy of Osseointegration, American Academy of Periodontology, and the American Dental Association. He has had articles published in the *Journal of Dental Research* and the *Journal of Periodontology*.

After graduation, Dr. Diamond plans to move back home to Ontario, Canada, and provide dental service to patients by way of full-time clinical periodontal-implant dentistry practice, part-time clinical teaching, and his part-time legal practice.

Ahmed El-Halaby, D.D.S., has been conducting microbiological testing to examine the relationship between failed hip and knee joint implants and the periodontal condition of the individuals receiving the implants. He says his studies



at the CWRU dental school have enhanced his ability to accurately diagnose and identify problems, and apply the most suitable treatment modality in an evidence-based approach.



Nishant Joshi, D.D.S., plans to pursue a private practice in the Cleveland area after graduation. In his practice, "Patients will not only receive the best possible care, but will also be treated with the dignity and respect they deserve," he says. His research project at the CWRU dental school was a collaborative effort between the Department of Periodontology and Department of Urology at University Hospitals. It involved assessing the association between periodontitis and prostate-specific antigen levels in chronic prostatitis patients.
